	Notes on Reprints:		
	It can be difficult to distinguish the two reprints from examples of ES01 and ES02.		
	The reprints were made on folded sheets of paper, such that the embossing <b>always</b> appears multiple times. Whilst multiple embossing also occurs sometimes on examples of ESO1 and ESO2, a single impression of the embossing indicates an example of the original types.		
	1870 reprints were made on folded buff wove paper of size 216 – 250 x 283 – 289m 1898 reprints were made on folded yellowish wove paper of size 217 x 282 -283mm The 1898 reprints show considerable wear on the die, notably in the top left area not the word "General" (see <b>Fig. 1</b> )
